14:00	Workshops Johanna Stückler (Institution LTG – Lichttechnische Gesellschaft Österreich) Venue: Community Centre Out of the Bubble, Into the World – An interactive Workshop by LTG <i>Expert knowledge on light pollution is abundant - yet it rarely reaches the people who most need to act on it. Who exactly needs to understand this issue better? Local decision-makers? The wider public? Even the experts at this very symposium? This interactive workshop aims to bring different perspectives into one room to work through that question together - and from there, to develop concrete, shareable approaches for making expert knowledge land outside the room it was created in. We won't assume we already understand each other's challenges - that's part of what this session is for. So let's find out what might happen when researchers, activists, manufacturers, and lighting designers work together on a question that affects all of us: how do we make our expertise land - accessible, credible, and actionable - outside our own professional bubble? This session is for anyone who has felt the gap between what we know and what actually gets done - and who's ready to close it, together.</i> Christina Pichler-Koban (E.C.O. Institut für Ökologie) Venue: Lower floor, Conference Centre Quellalpin How to become a "Rising STAR"? <i>The "Rising STARS project team" will provide a brief insight on their initial experiences of the FFG-project. The aim of the project is to share knowledge, strengthen skills as well as participation and networking in the field of light pollution. Participants will discuss the challenges and success factors associated with such initiatives and consider, together, opportunities for collaboration or for launching similar projects in their own communities.
